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## Grants Competition and Grant Renewal Key Activities and Dates (for calendar year 2008 grants)

The Legal Services Corporation (LSC) awards grants for the provision of civil legal services to low-income persons. LSC funding is awarded through a system of competition, pursuant to LSC's competitive bidding regulation, 45 C.F.R. §1634, and the LSC Appropriation Act. Eligible applicants for LSC funding include: 1) current LSC recipients; 2) nonprofit organizations that have as a purpose the furnishing of legal assistance to eligible clients; 3) private attorneys, groups of private attorneys or law firms; 4) state or local governments; and 5) substate regional planning and coordination agencies.

LSC evaluates each grant application based on widely recognized quality standards, including the American Bar Association Standards for the Provision of Civil Legal Aid and the LSC Performance Criteria. LSC's selection criteria are detailed at 45 C.F.R. §1634.9. Pursuant to the statute and regulation, LSC's competitive bidding process prohibits preference to current or previous recipients of LSC funds.
